PRINCESS NWAKEGO IBRAHIM-PAM is the Founder and Executive Director of Petra-Speech & Early Childhood Developmental Centre (PECC).

Her organisation PECC is an inclusive educational centre which has been in existence in Tunisia for over two decades.

Princess Nwakego is also the Founder and Chairperson of the Expat Professional and Business Women's Network (EPBWN) International, with chapters in the different countries.

EPBWN works in collaboration with other Network's Corporate sponsors, Embassies, NGOs, and International Organizations for training and capacity building.

She has previously worked with the International Criminal Court (ICC) in The Hague as the first Administrative Assistant to the director of the Department in charge of relocating the court to its permanent site. She has also worked with the International Criminal Tribunal for former Yugoslavia (ICTY) as a Judge's Assistant assisting to bring to justice all those involved in the genocide in the Baltic countries. Her experience includes working with the British Council Nigeria on Universal Basic Education Project and also collaboration with the Israeli Embassy in Nigeria as their MASHAV Coordinator for several years.

She is actively involved in many charity organizations in various countries and was the president of an international women's organization known as Aglow International, in The Hague for many years.

She currently resides in Songdo, Incheon South Korea where she has received an award of recognition by the Korean government for her contributions to the Korean and expatriate communities in Korea.
